## <u>AGM</u>

#### **DDDC**

To paint the inside of the Pavilion we had an excellent turnout of 10 people, we made up by far the vast majority of the team who came to help that day. Les Warren has to make a date for the outside to be done.

DDDC have been much more responsive to mowing the grass as the season had progressed, which is encouraging. They had not been forthcoming about us using our mower. However this changed when we asked about them mowing the lawns October onwards as they responded to report that they had insufficient manpower and suggested we do our own mowing.

This means that our season may stretch beyond mid-October as long as the grass can be maintained at a playable length and the weather is kind. We have also contacted DDDC about 2014 and they have said we can begin to mow the grass ourselves early in the season next year.

With Les now stating that the Pavilion is for multi-club use he proposes to hold a joint meeting in November when each club's storage needs will be discussed.
